Book of the Month



This One Summer
By Jillian Tamaki
and Mariko Tamaki

I think we can learn something from “This One Summer” by Mariko and Jillian Tamaki. The work reminds me of the annoyances I went through as I transitioned into adolescence. Interestingly, the Tamaki cousins use illustrations as well as words to fuel their story. Jillian Tamaki’s use of the invariant blue in her illustrations gives a sad, yet genuine glimpse throughout the narrative. We observe Rose and her family (along with some very interesting characters) during their summer getaway. Something is amiss; and it all occurs off the page, except when it doesn’t. When that is the case, it’s all confusing, and cumbersome to watch (and understand). Rose and her friend Wendy find ways to cope with the strangeness of the vacation, but they find themselves in more dilemmas than they started off with. The graphic novel isn’t overwhelmingly thorough or completely transparent; it’s painstakingly real. It’s a story for parents. It’s a story for those growing up. It’s a story to share and to remember together.
