- *Summary:*

- *On Sunday, officers responded to a bike theft that had just occurred. Officers located the suspect in the area. He was arrested for theft.*
- *On Sunday, officers responded to an unresponsive female in the Police Department's public parking lot. She was found to have taken an overdose of medication. She was transported to the hospital for medical treatment and a mental health evaluation was placed on her.*
- *Early Monday morning, a drunk driver crashed into a streetlight and several parked vehicles in the downtown district. The driver and one of his passengers were injured as a result of the collisions. The driver was checked out at the hospital and later booked into the county jail for felony driving under the influence.*
- *On Monday night, a resident called to report a naked man in their downstairs bathroom. Officers responded and detained the suspect. The location was a combination business with a residence upstairs. The suspect, a transient, had found an unlocked door and apparently entered with the intent to use the bathroom, shower, and to sleep there that night. He was arrested for trespassing.*
- *On Tuesday, officers were dispatched to a disturbance between two dog owners. Upon arrival, officers were met by an uncooperative male; the male refused to comply with officers and began yelling that he was going to harm another involved person. After a few minutes, the officers were able to calm the male and arrest him for making criminal threats and delaying an officer.*
- *On Tuesday night, UPD officers were dispatched to a reported fight involving 30+ people and shots fired at the Skate Park in Memorial Park. Officers were able to determine no shots were actually fired; however, at least one of the involved parties was hit over the head with a skateboard and several*

*cars had their windows broken. None of the victims stayed to talk to the police. The subject who had been hit in the head by the skateboard did go to Kaiser-Ontario for treatment. He was uncooperative and his injuries were not severe.*

- *On Wednesday, an officer was sent to a call of a transient causing a disturbance. The officer discovered the transient had been involved in a robbery two months prior. The investigating detective responded and interviewed the male who admitted involvement. The male was booked at the county jail for robbery.*
  - *On Wednesday, a mother requested assistance with her drug addicted son who had battered her. The male was arrested for a drug warrant; once arrested, he became combative. The male kicked the police car, attempted to kick out the windows to the unit, began spitting at the officers, and threatened to kill them. With the assistance of fire department personnel, the male was sedated and taken to the hospital; the male was booked at the county jail for his drug warrant, felony resisting, and being under the influence of a controlled substance.*
  - *On Thursday night, a fixed site License Plate Reader alerted on a stolen car. Officers located the vehicle and conducted a high-risk stop. Both occupants were arrested - the driver for being in possession of the stolen car and methamphetamine, and the passenger for possession of meth and drug paraphernalia.*
  - *On Friday morning, officers were sent to a residence for a disturbance. When they arrived, they learned a male suspect had hit his girlfriend several times. The suspect then armed himself with a steak knife and threatened the girlfriend if she did not give him her money. The suspect was given money and left the area in his vehicle before the officers arrived. The investigation is ongoing.*
  - *On Friday, officers responded to a transient breaking into a storage room outside of a business. Officers arrived and the suspect fled on foot after pushing one of the officers. The suspect was eventually arrested after a foot pursuit and was booked for felony resisting arrest, vandalism and trespassing.*
  - *On Friday, officers responded to a safety check on a female who had posted pictures of her cutting herself. Officers contacted and committed her for a mental health evaluation.*
  - *On Saturday morning, officers were notified of a stolen vehicle from a License Plate Reader. The vehicle was located with two occupants who were detained but not arrested. The report will be sent to the Corona Police Department for follow-up investigation.*
  - *On Saturday, officers responded to a call of a beer theft that had just occurred. The suspect was located a short distance away drinking the stolen alcohol. He was arrested for theft.*
  - *On Saturday, a vehicle went through a license plate reader indicating it was associated with a male wanted for armed robbery with a knife out of Upland. The vehicle was located nearby and the suspect was arrested for the robbery, as well as a related charge of felony domestic violence.*

- *Summary:*

- *On Sunday, officers responded to a call of a male causing a disturbance. The male was protesting on a sidewalk near a golf course. While doing so, he was yelling profanities and making rude hand gestures at passing individuals. The male was subsequently arrested for disturbing the peace and was booked at West Valley Detention Center.*

- *On Sunday, officers responded to a call of a garage burglary in progress. Officers arrived and located a male suspect within the garage. He was arrested for burglary and possession of a dagger.*
- *On Wednesday, officers responded to a call of a female passed out behind the wheel of a vehicle. She was arrested for DUI.*
- *On Wednesday evening, UPD received a report of multiple subjects smoking marijuana and drinking in a public park. Responding officers contacted several teens and young adults, and confirmed this. The four were all cited for possession of marijuana and for being a minor in possession of alcohol.*
- *On Thursday morning, a call was received regarding a trespassing in progress. Employees arriving at an abandoned building noticed the building had been broken into. One male transient was arrested as he exited the building. No other subjects were located in a search of the building. The building is abandoned/vacant and is in the process of being demolished.*
- *Officers followed up on a tip of possible drug sales at a residence in the 1400 block of E 9th St. As they were approaching the house, the subject they were looking for pulled up in a stolen vehicle. He was detained and a search of his residence was conducted. The search turned up a sawed off shotgun, rifle, ammunition, and drugs. The car was returned to the owner and the suspect was booked at West Valley Detention Center for several felony crimes.*
- *On Friday, a transient walked into the Police Department's lobby area and began to set up an encampment. He was arrested for possession and under the influence of narcotics.*
- *On Friday, officers responded to a residence for a female who called a neighboring police department and stated she wanted to be shot by police. Officers arrived and committed her for a mental health evaluation.*
- *On Friday, an officer heard gunfire in the 800 block of Orchid Court and saw a vehicle speeding away. Other officers assisted and a vehicle pursuit was initiated. The pursuing officers lost the suspect vehicle in the City of Pomona. A few minutes later, Pomona Police located the suspect vehicle unoccupied. A 17-year-old shooting victim was located on Orchid Court. He was treated and released at a local hospital for a gunshot wound to the leg. The shooting is under investigation by the Detective Bureau.*
- *On Saturday, officers responded to a call of a female and male arguing within a park. Officers arrived and arrested one for warrants and the other for under the influence of an illegal substance.*
- *On Saturday, officers were sent to a residence to investigate a male not known to the resident, who was sleeping on the resident's porch. The male was contacted and found to be a parolee at large. He was arrested for his warrant. While being booked at the county jail, it was discovered that he had narcotics hidden upon his person. He was charged with bringing contraband into a jail facility.*
- *Upland PD SMASH officers participated in a sweep on June 12th. This sweep took place in Yucaipa and was put on by the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Dept. Our officers made dozens of contacts, many of which were gang members, parolees, and probationers. We made 14 of the 45 arrests for charges such as possession of dangerous weapons, drugs, and warrants. We then assisted searching for two attempted murder suspects from a shooting that took place near the Upland High School in*

the City of Pomona.
