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Upland Public Library

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Serve as a point of contact at the Library to ensure that veterans and veteran families of every era know how to get connected to the state and federal benefits and services they have earned through military service. By being a Veterans Benefits Coach, you can help improve the lives of veterans and their families.

As a volunteer, some of your responsibilities would be to:

- Work the Veterans Resource Center in the library for a minimum of one-2-hour-shift per week to meet with veterans and/or family members.
- Serve as expert listener and initial problem solver.
- Guide the veteran toward benefits that help to enhance their situation.
- Help veterans use the California Veteran's Resource Book.
- Provide contact information for the County Veterans Service Office in their county of residence, so they can make an appointment.
- Keep a log by date of the number of veterans/family members served, the type of questions asked, referrals made, and issues/topics needed but not covered in the library's collection.

To qualify, you need to have:

- Interest in helping and serving veterans and their families;
- Patience, empathy and good listening and interpersonal skills;
- Familiarity with military life, veterans' issues, reintegration challenges, or willingness to learn; and
- Basic computer and internet skills and smart phone experience.




Book-Enders Bonus

Change a Life: Become an Adult Literacy Tutor

Are you looking for a rewarding way to volunteer in our community while helping an adult improve their life? The Adult Literacy program provides free, private, one-on-one tutoring for low literate adults seeking assistance in improving reading, writing, vocabulary and comprehension skills.

Tutor Training for this program will take place on Saturday, November 14th from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. in the Carnegie Building. Once trained, Literacy Tutors are matched with students based on schedule availability.

Upland Adult Literacy Program

The Upland Public Library Adult Literacy Program provides free adult literacy tutoring services to Upland residents and the surrounding communities.

Adults 18 and older, who wish to participate as a student or as a volunteer tutor can contact the Adult Literacy Center at (909) 931-4211.

The Literacy Center is located in the beautifully renovated Carnegie Library of Upland.

Adult Learners

The literacy program helps English speaking adults that live in the City of Upland to learn and/or improve basic reading, writing and life skills. You must be 18 to enroll.

- Students are matched with a trained volunteer tutor for free one-on-one tutoring.
- Instruction is "Learner Centered" based on the individual student's needs and goals.
- Students and tutors meet once or twice a week for an hour to an hour and a half.

- Students must commit to 6 months of tutoring.
- All learning materials and curriculum provided by the Adult Literacy Center.

Volunteer Tutors

Volunteer tutors work with adults who want to improve their literacy skills in English.

- All potential tutors must attend Tutor Training prior to starting with a student.
- Tutors work on a one-to-one basis with their student.
- Tutors are flexible, tutors are matched based on their availability.

How can you help the Adult Literacy Program?

- Volunteer your time as a Literacy Tutor.
- Refer students, tutors, and other volunteers to join the Adult Literacy Program.

Since its inception in 1989, the Upland Public Library's Adult Literacy Program has helped over 1,100 English speaking adults improve their basic reading and writing skills by matching adult learners with trained volunteer tutors for free one-on-one tutoring at the Upland Library.

All proceeds benefit the Upland Public Library Adult Literacy program, whose state funding is determined by the amount of local monies raised. This year the Trivia Bee raised \$3,622 for the Adult Literacy Program.
